Discussion Item	Second Reading Ordinance Amending the Takoma Park Code to Add Environmentally Preferable Purchasing		
Background	The City Code, Chapter 7.08.140 provides for a general preference for the purchase of recycled products and allows for a price preference of up to 15%. The Chapter requires that all City stationary and envelopes include recycled content, as well as the City Newsletter and any paper printed by outside printing contractors for the City.		
	The Committee on the Environment (COE) recommends that the City expand the current preference to encompass a broader range of items and services and add a preference for locally available products and services to the criteria. The COE evaluated model language provided by the University of Maryland Sustainable Maryland Certified program and the City of Hyattsville. The COE developed a draft ordinance which was reviewed and edited by the City Attorney's Office.		
	The Council discussed the ordinance at its work session on June 2. After the work session, the draft ordinance was revised by Cindy Dyballa, Co-Chair of the Committee on the Environment, to incorporate the changes desired by the Council. The City Attorney has reviewed the revised ordinance.		
	First reading of the ordinance was held on July 14. At that time, the Council amended the ordinance at Section 7.08.145.E.5 to refer to the federal (U.S. EPA) standards. Subsection E.6 was added to reference current examples of industry standards that may be followed.		
Policy	The City Council authorizes any changes to the City Code.		
Fiscal Impact	The current draft ordinance includes a price preference of up to 15%. The cost for purchasing environmentally preferable and locally sourced goods and services can be anticipated to increase costs; however, impact will be dependent upon the quantity of items and services purchased.

Takoma Park Code, Title 7, Purchasing and Taxation, Division 1, Purchasing, 30 Chapter 7.08 Source Selection and Contract Formation is amended by adding a 31 new section as follows: 32 33 Section 7.08.145 Environmentally preferable purchasing. 34 35 General Preferences. Environmental and energy considerations shall become part of the 36 City's normal purchasing and procurement decisions, with the goals of justifying environmental 37 and energy costs of City decisions and choosing minimal-effect options, consistent with such 38 traditional factors as safety, price, performance, and availability. The City also prefers to do 39 business with vendors and contractors that are locally owned, use and sell environmentally 40 preferable products or services, produce minimal waste, and use recycled products and environmentally preferable purchasing practices, as services provided by local suppliers reduce 41 environmental impact due to transportation and keep municipal funds in the community. To the 42 greatest extent practicable, the City shall purchase environmentally and energy preferable 43 44 products and services that: 45 46 1. Use recycled materials.

6	or purchase of specific environmentally preferable or locally available products, the City shall
7	consider, among other relevant factors, product availability, product longevity, and product
8 9	suitability for its intended use, including whether the product meets established performance standards, any adverse impact of the product on the health and safety of employees and residents
10	and cost. Nothing contained in this section shall require a City department, purchaser, or
11	contractor to procure or purchase products that do not perform adequately for their intended use,
12	exclude adequate competition, or cost more than 15% above the standard cost for the product.
